The objectives surrounding these industrial visits are to discover technologies within existing companies in the aluminium field, and to allow you to foster new relationships and business opportunities. Bombardier – A unique industrial visit not to be missed!

In October 2013, this visit was a hit with a full house of participants. The Saint-Laurent plant has more than 3000 employees and is the largest Bombardier installation in the region. The plant, which initially was home to Canadair, produces most of the parts and components needed for the Challenger and Global bioreactors, the CRJ airliner and Q400's next generation, as well as the amphibian Bombardier 415. The acquisition of Canadair, 25 years ago originated Bombardier's involvement in the aerospace industry. Recently, Bombardier renovated over 9000 square feet (100 000 pi²) of its Montreal plant to sustain the production of key components for its new Cseries. The mobile assembly line and process are entirely automated and are equipped with the most recent and advanced value added principles. The modernization includes new state of the art machineries, tools and equipment.
